Creativity is the freest form of self-expression. There is nothing more satisfying and fulfilling for children than to be able to express themselves openly and without judgement. The ability to be creative, to create something from personal feelings and experiences, can reflect and nurture children's emotional health. The experiences children have during their initial years of life can significantly enhance the development of their creativity.

Here students love to express themselves and their ideas using crayons, paints, playdough, clay, scissors, glue and paper. One might find their child needs help to use thin pencils, scissors or sticky tape. Child will begin making basic shapes, and might enjoy experimenting with texture, space and colors in pieces of art. For example, in school, ward often draw houses with shining suns above the roof. This is because this kind of picture is made up of basic shapes like squares, triangles and circles. Art activities also let your child make decisions for themselves. For example, should roof be red or blue?









Visit to temple



Long ago, wise old men used to go to the mountains to meditate and be at one with God. The peace that they found there, they wanted to bring back to the towns and villages, so they built temples. The shrines represent caves, the pillars, trees and the pinnacles, the mountain peaks. 

अन्नकुट महोत्सव


28 अक्टूबर 2019 सोमवार, 11:00 am से 07:00 pm
